Puppy Care and Vaccines Protocol

New puppies require a lot of things; from food and treats to toys and bedding, so those first days at home are very busy. After picking a name, the next thing you should do is see your veterinarian for a wellness check and to start vaccinations.

At 6-8 weeks of age, puppies get several sets of vaccines every 3-4 weeks until fully vaccinated for the year. Each series should include a deworming to ensure standard puppy worms are treated. Puppies are not given the Rabies vaccine until after 12 weeks of age.

A puppy is not protected against dangerous factors in the outside environment until they are fully vaccinated. Until this time, we do not recommend taking your pet out of its home and yard environment unless given approval by a veterinarian. Below is the normal puppy vaccination protocol. This protocol may be modified by the veterinarian due to age or size of your pet.

First Visit (6-8 weeks) - Date

Schedule spay or neuter at local veterinary hospital.

Next vaccines in 6 months to a year. See you then!
